Appendix A: Types of Experiences

Concentration Camp Survivor – People placed in Death Camps, Forced Labor Camps, and Concentration Camps.

Émigré – People targeted for death by the Nazi Regime who left their home country to safety before 1941.

Ghetto Survivor – People confined in ghetto areas, sometimes as a precursor to being sent to the camps.

Kindertransport – Children targeted by the Nazi Regime who were rescued from central Europe by the British government in a special mission nine months prior to World War II.

Liberator – People who served in the Allied Armed Forces who liberated those imprisoned in the camps across Europe.

Shanghai Survivor – People targeted by the Nazi Regime who emigrated to the safe refuge in Shanghai, China in the years 1938-1941.

Resistance – People who served as part of an irregular, organized force engaging Nazi troops in guerilla warfare i.e. partisans, underground.

Rescuer – People who performed individual acts of kindness for those targeted by the Nazi Regime.

Hidden – People targeted by the Nazi Regime who survived by hiding themselves.

Passing – People targeted by the Nazi Regime who survived by changing their identity.

Witness – People not targeted by the Nazi Regime who witnessed the persecution of others.
